



CODE OF CONDUCT

The protection of the dignity of the individual is a fundamental claim of VCO.

The general rules for behaviour of drivers and teams (or their associates) in a VCO-related event are:

- Respect the rights, dignity and worth of all competitors regardless of their gender, ability, cultural background or religion**
- Verbal abuse of officials and other drivers and deliberately distracting or provoking a competitor are not acceptable or permitted behaviours in any VCO competition**
- If you disagree with a decision of Race Control or VCO Officials, please use the given opportunities to file an official protest**
- Control your temper all times**
- Don't bully or take unfair advantage of another competitor**
- Display modesty in victory and graciousness in defeat**
- Don't race intoxicated or drink alcohol during a VCO event**
- Comply with anti-doping policies**
- Actions whose recognisable aim is to deliberately cause harm to a competitor are never tolerated**
- Drivers must race under their own name. Drivers may not use a proxy to participate in their place**

These rules concern driving activities as well as public or private communications (e.g. on social media channels, in chats or forums, in direct messages).

In case of misbehaviour, Race Control and VCO may penalise the competitor and/or exclude him from any VCO competition.
